## Refugee Update

The new year has started off with a bang after a lull in December. Clients have arrived from the following countries:

Bhutan - 16, Iran - 2, Iraq - 16, Russia - 5, Somalia - 21, Sudan - 1

TOTAL arrivals is 51 since January and 61 since October (our fiscal year). This includes 21 school aged children. By April 13th we expect to have 69 refugees arrived by April 13th

based on the numbers above (with 2 highschoolers). We have also recieved about 5 new adult asylee clients and are expecting an entire family of asylees arriving to join their relative shortly.

We actually are receiving about the same number of refugees as last year overall, but the arrivals have been coming much more bunched together this year with a very heavy January to March quarter bringing in about 50% of the full year arrivals. We are projected to receive about 120 for this year in total.

#### HOW WE ARE DOING:

As of mid-March we are up there with two other DPA sites in cases closed from public assistance due to earnings. However, so many of our clients are literally in the US less than 6 weeks, so this will hopefully be an underestimate of our year end percentages since these folks have just not started actively job seeking yet. We have about 63% success right now in employing individuals within 6 months of arrival. This is a program low for us, we are usually in the 70-90% range and hope that with spring hitting, many clients will be getting more jobs. We are struggling with clients getting many more parttime hours than full time.

#### PROGRAM UPDATES:

We have started a new capacity building grant, the Emerging Communities Project, which will award 6 ethnic community and faith based groups with training, technical assistance and funds to develop their capacity to serve their own communities. This is an exciting opportunity to develop leadership in the immigrant, indigenous and refugee community groups.
