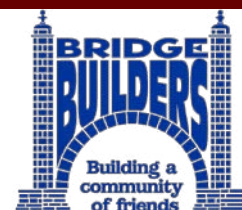

National Kidney Foundation Serving Alaska to Offer Free Health Screening

The National Kidney Foundation Serving Alaska will offer a free health screening for people at increased risk for kidney disease on Saturday, June 13th at ChangePoint Church in South Anchorage. If you have high blood pressure, diabetes or a family history of these conditions or kidney failure, you are at risk for kidney disease. Appointments are available between 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. To pre-register, call 223-1562 or email Kristie.lemmon@kidney.org. Walk ins are also welcome and parking is available.

"We know that if we start early with education, detection and if necessary, medical intervention, we can often postpone the onset of kidney disease or kidney failure," says Kristie Lemmon, KEEP Program Manager. Twenty six million Americans have chronic kidney disease and most don't know it. Early detection and treatment of chronic kidney disease, including lifestyle changes and medications, may SLOW or PREVENT its progression to kidney failure and lessen the risk of cardiovascular disease.

Dear Friend of RAIS:

You are one of the best friends the Refugee Assistance and Immigration Services (RAIS) program has. Thank you for the interest that you have taken in helping refugees settle into a new life in Alaska! Through these emails you are also aware of some of the immediate material needs that these individuals and families have upon arrival. I would like to tell you of two other needs that are so important as the refugees become a part of our community.

"Help someone help themselves," or "a hand up, not a hand out." If that is how you like to help your community - then read on! You can help the refugees in our RAIS program by supporting the Garden Project or the Transportation Fund. The goals for both projects are for refugees to become self-sustaining and successful. Please join us in making that happen!

RAIS Garden Project

Do you remember completing your last job application? Do you remember that you were asked if you had a valid AK driver's license, or asked how you would get to work? Most of us are fortunate enough to take that answer for granted, or to use our bike or the bus system as alternative transportation. The refugees who come to Alaska are not so fortunate. Our RAIS staff works very hard in preparing the refugees with language skills, job seeking skills, even interviewing skills. But what good are those if you cannot get to the job interview? Or if the bus doesn't run at 11:30 when you have to be at work? Or the cost of a cab eats up most of the pay you earn for the day's work? Access to necessary transportation will help these families become more independent and minimize the feeling of isolation in their new home.

We have a goal of raising **\$10,000** for the RAIS Transportation Fund. If \$10,000 sounds like a lot, **imagine** the difference you will make in the lives of the families who get this help. How will your gift be used?
