National Kidney Foundation Serving Alaska to Offer Free Health Screening

A FREE Kidney Health Screening will be offered by the National Kidney Foundation Serving Alaska for people at increased risk for kidney disease on Saturday, December 12th at the Mountain Boys and Girls Club at 315 Price Street in Anchorage from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. If you have high blood pressure or diabetes, or a member of your immediate family has high blood pressure, diabetes or kidney disease, you are at risk for kidney disease. **We encourage you to schedule an appointment for the free screening** by calling 223-1562, 877-889-6318 or emailing [Kristie.Lemmon@kidney.org](mailto:Kristie.Lemmon@kidney.org). There is limited availability for walk ins. Participants must be 18 years or older.

The screening is part of the National Kidney Foundation's Kidney Early Evaluation Program (KEEP) designed to identify and educate people at risk - those with diabetes, high blood pressure or a family history of kidney disease. KEEP screening participants will have their weight and blood pressure checked. Medical professionals will collect blood and urine samples from those who require further testing. A physician is on-site to review results with participants.

More than 26 millions Americans have chronic kidney disease and most don't even know it. Millions more are at risk.

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## **New Scholarship Program for Immigrant Families**

### **Western Union Foundation Announces New Scholarship Program for Immigrant Families**

Deadline: February 5, 2010

The Western Union Foundation's Family Scholarship Program is a new educational initiative for migrants, immigrants, and their families in the United States.

The Family Scholarship Program is intended to help two members of the same family move up the economic development ladder through education. Scholarships may be

used for tuition for college/university education language acquisition classes, technical/skill training, and/or financial literacy. For example, one family member may request assistance to attend college and the other family member may request assistance to attend English as a Second Language courses.

All applicants must be 18 or older. The country of origin for at least one of the applicants must be outside the U.S.

Applications must include educational providers for primary and secondary award recipients (must be two family members). Scholarships will only be made to nonprofit accredited higher education institutions and nonprofit training/education providers.

Recipients are eligible to receive scholarships in amounts of \$1,000 to \$5,000 per family.

Recipients are determined in a selection process independently managed by the Institute of International Education, an international nonprofit educational exchange organization.

**HOPE VI Main Street Grant Program**

**For smaller communities, this looks like a really interesting source to support housing in a historic town center.** The purpose in the NOFA reads:

*The purpose of the HOPE VI Main Street program is to provide grants to small communities to assist in the rejuvenation of an historic or traditional central business district or "Main Street" area by replacing unused commercial space in buildings with affordable housing units.*

I've copied an excerpt from the NOFA that identifies eligible applicants, to help you determine whether or not to take a closer look.

*A. Eligible Applicants. Eligible applicants include, and are limited to, local governments, as defined in Section I.D. of this program NOFA. The local government must:*

- 1. Have a population of 50,000 or less; and*
- 2. Not be served by a local government, county/parish, regional, or state public housing agency (PHA) that administers more than 100 physical public housing units within the local government's jurisdiction. Such units exclude Section 8 Housing Voucher subsidized units and public housing units in Mixed-Finance developments where the PHA is not the General Partner in the for-profit ownership entity.*
